
# What does Manchester really need?

Maybe you think it needs some football success. Maybe you think it needs better weather. Maybe some cheaper houses.

Maybe if you're being more honest you want the homeless to be housed. Crime to be reduced. Neighbourhoods to feel safer.

But what lies at the heart of our desires for change? And what lies at the heart of

the issues that hold our city back from being all it can be?



In the midst of the pain, the frustration and hardship of struggles with poverty, addiction, loneliness and isolation, Manchester needs a move of God.

When God moves, lives are transformed. When people know the love of God, love for our neighbours can flow out. When we receive the great gift of who Jesus is, we are freed up to give and share our resources.

When God moves, life flows through a city.

When God moves, his compassion is poured into people.



When God truly moves, relationships are restored. The poor are lifted out of poverty.

Our desperate need for a move of God is why we spent the whole month of January coming together to pray for our city. Right in the city centre at Methodist Central Hall.



Crying out to God to transform our city for good.

We came together from different parts of the city. North, south, east, west.

From different denominations. Methodists and Pentecostals.

Baptists and Anglicans.

We came together. We looked not at our differences but at the God who unites us. And we cried out to him, asking him to transform our city.

And here we are in July, and we are seeing first fruits growing. Young people who have never stepped foot in a church building in their lives are giving church a go for the first time. Right here in this city. People from all over the world are in our city, and people from many nations are hearing about Jesus and they want to know more.
