Dear Friends,

In C.S. Lewis's book the Lion the Witch and the wardrobe there is a lion Aslan, who is meant to be for us a picture of Jesus. When the children are told they are about to meet this lion one asks "Is he safe?" "Course he isn't safe" they are told, "but he's good. He's the King".

Jesus was not a safe person to be with - but he was good and he was King.

The problem was that where anything was wrong, it was not safe from his correction. If you wanted a quiet life, where no-one challenged your behaviour or motives, where nothing changed, where long cherished ideas about God and his world went unchallenged, however wrong they were, it was not safe to be around Jesus.

The disciple's lives were full of challenge and surprise - Jesus did not fit into any safe role or category, and he was constantly showing them that other people didn't either: He was critical of the pharisees - whom noone dared say a word against, he spent his time with outcasts, he spoke to a Samaritan woman.

They thought they knew exactly what the Messiah would do to bring in the kingdom, until he talked of suffering and dying. On a number of occasions even Peter opposed Jesus until he was brought to understand.

Being around Jesus today is not safe either; we also can be wrong, even in ideas we have held for years, or that are so deep we are not even aware of them. We may have our plans and ideas, but if they are not God's they will be challenged. We may have secrets - but they are not safe from Jesus.

Yet Jesus is good, gentle, and the king. He is holy and true - all that is good and wholesome is safe with him. The children loved to be around the lion, and all who love truth love to be around Jesus, the source of truth. He is not safe, and will not guarantee us a quiet life -but he will lead us into all truth. Love in Our Lord. **Brian** 

#### OLDHAM AND TAMESIDE MISSIONAL PARTNERSHIP, MINISTER'S LETTER – JULY 2023 WORTH, WORK, WEARINESS AND WELL-BEING

The recent elders training day recognised the heavy burdens carried by our serving elders and it was focused on making life a bit easier for them – and, also and at the same time, on making them and their churches a bit more missional – or Jesus-shaped - in what they do. One of the most valuable sessions was on how to look after our own well-being and that of our 'fellow workers' even in difficult circumstances. Quotes of Jesus from recent Sunday readings from Matthew: 'Don't be afraid; even the hairs on your head are counted; you are worth more than many sparrows' (10:30-31).

'Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me' (10:38).

'Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.' (11: 29-30).

I am writing as colleges and schools are breaking up for summer holidays. We all need time for rest and relaxation. However, before bimonthly magazines are published again, autumn terms and church programmes will have begun again. Time and the work goes on.

At the time of Jesus, yokes made of wood were placed on the shoulders of oxen so that they could pull ploughs and other heavy loads. 'My yoke is easy' could mean 'my yoke will fit you well' - and could easily have been the marketing slogan of Jesus when he was a carpenter.

Now, as then, Jesus calls his disciples to take up their cross and follow him – to be yoked to Jesus – to put ourselves at his disposal. Now, as then, being a disciple of Jesus is a huge challenge – a life-long challenge. But Jesus says, 'my yoke will fit you well'.

The URC Basis of Union, leaning heavily on Paul's Ephesians 4, says 'The Lord Jesus Christ continues his ministry in and through the Church, the whole people of God called and committed to his service <u>and</u> equipped by him for it.'

So, whatever God's purposes are for you and for me, for our churches, and for our missional partnership, and however weak, tired, or inadequate we might feel we are, the promise is that we will be equipped for God's work. Our yokes will fit us well – they will be made to measure for us in the here and now. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we will be enabled and equipped to do what God in Jesus wants of us. So, the real challenge is to discern what it is that God requires of us.

In his commentary on Matthew 11: 29 – 30, William Barclay writes:

'It is not that the burden is easy to carry; but it is laid on us in love; it is meant to be carried in love; and love makes even the heaviest burdens feel light. When we remember how much we are loved by God, we know that our burden is to love God, ourselves, and one another, then the burden becomes like a song we can sing with joy in our hearts.'

As we carry the yoke of Jesus, we learn more of his character, his ease and carefulness, his joy and gentleness, all of which comes from his relationship with his Father – a relationship of love - a relationship which he invites us to share – 'you will find rest for your souls'.
